This office regrets to inform you that it is unable to issue a visa to you because you have been found ineligible to receive a visa under the following section(s) of the Immigration and Nationality Act. Joint Sponsor Documentation Incomplete:

Your Joint Sponsor's income is sufficient to meet the requirements of the Affidavit of Support, however, some documentation is missing.

The tax form included shows that the joint sponsor, is married filing jointly. The sponsor's spouse must sign an I-864A form unless there is evidence provided to show that all of the claimed income is from the joint sponsor. The spouse should also send proof of her citizenship or legal permanent resident status, namely, as copy of her US passport or greencard. An I-864A form can be downloaded from www.USCIS.gov

Before a visa can be issued, your case requires additional administrative processing. We will notify you when the review is complete, as it may take several months to complete. If you have not heard from us in 90 days, you should contact the Embassy to ensure that everything is okay in your case. It is your responsibility to keep the Embassy updated of any address or phone number changes for you, and to contact us every three months to ensure that your case is moving forward.
